Alexander G. Brice

Rushworth Chronicle

4 November, 1887

Just before going to press we were shocked to learn that our worthy townsman, Alexander G. Brice, had succumbed to the disease (consumption) to which he has been a sufferer for two years past.

His remains will probably be interred on Saturday next.

We also learn that from news received today his oldest son, James, who is in New South Wales, is also dying. It is probable that this direful news hurried on Mr Brice's decease.

The remains of the late Mr A. Bryce [Brice] were followed to the Rushworth Cemetery on Saturday last by a large number of friends.

The cortege was headed by the Rushworth Brass Band (of which he was a member), playing music appropriate to the occasion, and the coffin was borne by the members of the Foresters' Lodge with which he had been connected for a number of years.
