Another old resident of Rushworth passed to his long rest when Mr Alfred (Sam) Jones, of Stanhope Road, died after an illness from which he had been suffering for some time.

He was born in Wandong and came to reside in Rushworth when he was about 16 years of age, having thus lived here for most of his life.

Deceased, who was 60 years of age at the time of his death, was married to Miss May Hewitt at Rushworth 21 years ago and leaves a wife and two children (Alfred and Alice) to mourn the loss of a devoted husband and father.

The funeral took place to the Rushworth cemetery on Thursday last week, and was largely attended, exemplifying the esteem in which the late Mr. Jones was held by the residents of the town and district.
