CHARLETT --- On April 22nd, at Mooroopna Hospital, Archibald, eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Charlett, brother of Sadie (Mrs. Osborne), Christina, Maggie (Mrs. Callanan), Vic. (Mrs. Rodgers) and Bert, aged 57 years. A beautiful life ended.

An old resident of Rushworth, in the person of Mr. Archie Charlett passed away suddenly on Saturday 23rd inst., in the Mooroopna Hospital.

Mr. Charlett had not been too well lately, but he was able to be about. On Thursday of last week, Mr. C. Orht, who was a regular visitor to Mr. Charlett, went to see him at his residence, Paramatta Gully, and found him lying ill in his bed. He had him conveyed to the Mooroopna Hospital, but he passed away on the following Saturday, death being due to a paralytic stroke and haemorrhage of the brain.

The late Mr. Charlett, who was 57 years of age, was born at Heathcote and came to Rushworth when he was very young with his parents.

He went to Western Australia some years ago when the gold rush was on in that State and did very well there mining.

He returned to Rushworth two years later and has resided here ever since. He was engaged in mining, and sleeper-cutting, during his residence in Rushworth and was very well-known.

He was a good player of the violin (as was his father before him), and used to play at dances held in the district. He was unmarried.

He performed many acts of kindness and was of a retiring and upright character, his sudden death being deeply regretted by a large circle of friends.

The remains were brought from Mooroopna by motor hearse on Sunday last and interred in the Rushworth cemetery, a very large number of townspeople following the remains to their last resting place.

The burial service was conducted by Rev. F. Grist.
