Dysentery is very prevalent in this district just now, and has attacked both old and young. Some of the cases have been very severe, but up to the present only one death has occurred; Mr M. Carlin having lost his youngest child, who died yesterday morning after a short illness. The funeral will take place this afternoon.

Last week we were called upon to record the death of an infant, the child of Mr Carlin, from dysentery. Since then another has fallen a victim to the same disease, Mr H. Brideson having lost his only son, a fine little fellow, between four and five years old, who died on Thursday last.
