KYABRAM. (FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT.) 25th October, 1886.

In my last letter I mentioned that Mr H. Ryan, of Kyabram, had lost **a fine little girl** through diphtheria, and that his **eldest son** who was suffering from the same complaint was progressing slowly towards recovery.

I am sorry to say, however, that the favourable symptoms, which existed at the time of my writing, did not continue. Late on Monday night or early on Tuesday morning, a change for the worse set in, and by midnight on Tuesday the poor little sufferer had passed away, and the grief-stricken parents were left to mourn the loss of the **second of their family within one week.**

The funeral took place on Thursday, and the body was interred in the Rushworth cemetery where only the previous Saturday the little sister of deceased had been laid in her final rest.

The deepest sympathy is felt by all for the bereaved parents in their sore affliction.
