Twin daughter child of Mrs Fox

Mrs Fox was spending a holiday in Rushworth, and the child sickened on the Tuesday previous to its death from dentition, but there was no indication of any serious ailment.

The mother carefully attended the child, who progressed nicely till Friday afternoon, when a sudden change for the worse appeared.

Mrs Fox immediately sent for medical aid and Dr Christie saw and prescribed for the infant, but ere he had sufficient time to return, the little sufferer had passed away.

The doctor gave a certificate of death and the necessity for an inquest was dispensed with.

The remains were interred at Rushworth on Saturday last.

Much sympathy is felt for Mrs Fox in her bereavement. Some two years since Mrs Fox also lost a twin child.
