Another of the old identities, Mr Donald McLeod, of Nuggetty Gully, Rushworth, passed away on Sunday night last. Some time ago deceased burst a blood vessel and it was this cause which was immediately responsible for his death. He was very old identity of the Costerfield district from where he came to Rushworth residing here ever since. He followed the occupation of an engine driver and a miner and was familiar with the workings of most of the principal mines in the Costerfield and Rushworth districts.

Of a quiet and retiring disposition, he was a general favourite and was respected by all with whom he came in contact. Deceased was 66 years of age and leaves a widow and a grown-up family to mourn their loss.

The remains were interred at the Rushworth cemetery on Tuesday, a large number of mourners joining in the funeral cortege. The Rev. Joseph Ross conducted the service at the grave.
