DEATHS.

HOBDAY.—On the 24th March, at the Manse, Rushworth, of dysentery, Edward Percy, loved son of Henry E. and Emma S. Hobday; aged two years and five months.

A serious accident happened to Mr Hamilton, head teacher at the Graytown State School, on Friday last. He had come over to be present at the burial of one of Mr Hobday's children, who had died during the morning after a short attack of dysentery, and was returning home during the heat of the afternoon, which was very great, and while travelling between Whroo and Graytown was attacked with sunstroke, and fell out of the buggy in which he was riding, the horse going on with the trap, and arriving at Graytown without any accident.

A party was sent out immediately, and found Mr Hamilton, who had partially recovered consciousness, but still suffering from the exposure to the rays of the sun. He was not injured by the fall beyond a few scratches as he fortunately fell on a bed of sand. We're glad to say he is gradually improving, and it is hoped will be all right again in a few days.
