The death, at Mooroopna Hospital, on Thursday of last week, of Mr. Francis Guy, at the age of 73 years, after a short and sudden illness, removes another old resident of the district from our midst.

The deceased gentleman became seriously ill and was taken to Mooroopna Hospital on the previous Saturday, where he gradually became weaker and died as stated.

Mr. Guy was born in Tasmania and came to Rushworth about 50 years ago, and with the exception of the period between 1915 and 1917 in which he served in the A.I.F. in the Great War, has lived here ever since.

By his honest and upright character and his conscientiousness he had made many friends in this district, who will regret to learn of his sudden demise.

Deceased leave a widow and three sons, Messrs Frank, Leo and Vincent Guy, all of whom reside in Melbourne, to mourn their loss.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Friday last, the last rites of the Catholic Church being performed by the Rev. Father Tehan, and the service of the Returned Soldiers was read by Mr. A. Bryant.
