The death occurred on Tuesday at Mooroopna Mr Francis Jasper William Power Sutton, of Stanhope, at the age of about 52 years.

The death of Mr Sutton came as a shock to many friends in the district. He took suddenly ill over the weekend and was conveyed to hospital, where he died on Tuesday.

He was born in England. He served his country in the Great War, and came to Stanhope soon after hostilities ceased, being one of the first soldier settlers.

Although suffering from war disabilities, his health of late had been fairly good and there was no indication that the end was near.

The late Mr Sutton was liked and respected by all who came into contact with him. He is survived by two children --- Dulcie and Frank --- his wife having predeceased him about two years ago.

The remains were interred in Rushworth cemetery on Wednesday in the presence of a large gathering of returned soldiers and other friends. Mr W. Johnson, president of Stanhope branch R.S.S.I.L.A., paid the last tribute of the organisation to a departed comrade. The civil service was performed by Mr Matthews.

The funeral arrangements were carried out by Kittle Bros.
