Our readers will learn with regret of the death of Mr George King, which sad event occurred at his late residence, Moora Road, Rushworth on Tuesday last, after an illness extending over seven or eight years.

Deceased was the eldest son of the late Walter King, of Costerfield, and came to Rushworth over 20 years ago. He suffered from an affection of the lungs, and during the past couple of years his health was very bad indeed, in fact it was generally recognised that it was purely his determination and pluck which kept him going.

Deceased was quite a young man, being but 37 years of age, and was widely and favourably known right throughout the district, and his demise is generally deplored. He was a married man with a family of six young children, the youngest being but four years of age, and much sympathy is felt for the bereaved wife and children in their misfortune.

The remains will be interred in the Rushworth cemetery this (Friday) afternoon, the funeral being timed to leave deceased's late residence at three o'clock.
