A large number of our readers will learn with regret that Mr G. A. Scurry, rate-collector for the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga, breathed his last in Melbourne on Wednesday morning, from an internal ailment, from which he has been suffering for some years.

Mr Scurry was an old resident of this district, having been in the employ of Messrs Cox and Routledge, at Rushworth, some twenty years since.

After the sale of their business he went to Woods Point but afterwards returned about the time of the Spring Creek rush.

During the last 10 years he has been a prominent member and local lay-reader of the United Methodist body, for whom he did good service by assisting to establish a number of places of worship, both in this and the Echuca district.

Mr Scurry was highly respected for his honesty, straightforwardness, and many other good qualities. He leaves a widow and large family to mourn their loss.
