Mr. George Joshua Marks, eldest son of Mrs. and the late Mr. Geo. Marks, passed away suddenly at his residence, Moora road on Tuesday morning last.

Mr. Marks had not been in good health lately and a few weeks ago was an inmate of the Mooroopna Hospital. He returned home about two months and seemed to have somewhat recovered.

On Tuesday morning he was seized with a violent fit of coughing and haemorrhage, and suddenly expired.

The late Mr. Marks was a native of Rushworth, and was 41 years of age. He was respected by a large number of friends and his sudden death was deeply regretted. He leaves a widow and three young children.

The funeral took place on Wednesday, the remains being interred in the Rushworth cemetery. The funeral cortege was a large one and included members of the Rushworth branch of the Australian Natives Association, of which deceased was a member.

In the absence of the Rev. Canon Grist (who is indisposed), the Rev. H. H. Nixon, of Murchison, conducted the burial service.
