DEATH OF OLD IDENTITY

Old residents will regret to learn (says the "Rushworth Chronicle") that Henry Braddy, of Moora road, Rushworth, expired on Friday last.

The deceased, who was born in Kent, England, came to this state in the early fifties, first going to Bendigo. From there he went to the great rush at Mclvor in 1853, afterwards coming to Rushworth about the year 1859, and he has resided here ever since.

He followed the occupation of a miner for many years, but lately kept a wine shop. He leaves one son to mourn his loss.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on the following day. The Rev. J. R. Walker officiated at the grave and; Mr Anderson was the undertaker.
