Henry Marshall (Henry Thompson)

Marshall.—At Simon Fraser's, Stanhope Road, Rushworth, on the 6th of June, Henry Marshall (better known as H. M. Thompson), son of Mr Marshall, of Marshall, Sons and Co., Engineers, Gainsborough, England.

S. Fraser was a great friend of Marshall's since he left the employment of the Messrs Winter Bros., whose architect he was during the erection of their residences, he having mostly made his home at his (Fraser's) place when out of work.

Henry Marshall Thompson (or properly, Henry Marshall), an architect well known throughout the Rushworth and Murchison districts since the early days, expired at Mr Simon Fraser's residence, Stanhope road, on Monday last.

Thompson, who was a first-class carpenter and builder and architect, found employment under the Messrs Winter Bros, for a number of years, afterwards taking jobs from various farmers.

The deceased was a son of Mr Marshall, of Messrs Marshall and Sons, the well-known firm of Gainsborough, England, but he took the name of Thompson when he came out to the colony.

Dr Heily attended to him in his last illness, which was caused by general break-up of the system.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Tuesday, the Rev. J. R. Walker officiated at the grave. Mr Anderson was the undertaker.
