We much regret to have to record the death of Mr James Lambden, which took place at his residence, Rushworth, on Wednesday morning last, at the ripe age of 75 years.

Mr Lambden was a very old colonist, having arrived in Victoria in 1853.

He first started business as a bootmaker in Melbourne, but failing health compelled him to relinquish this for a time, and he started about the first market garden in Brighton.

Subsequently he went to the Mt. Blackwood and Dunolly diggings, and eventually settled in Rushworth in 1871.

Deceased suffered severely from cancer in the neck, which fell disease was the cause of his death.

Mr Lambden leaves a widow [Caroline] and three children, all of the latter being married.

The remains were inferred in the Rushworth cemetery yesterday afternoon.
