Mr James Eustace's many friends will learn with regret that he expired at his residence, Murchison road, on Wednesday.

The deceased, who arrived on Rushworth in 1858, has followed the occupation of a miner nearly the whole of that time. He also was for some years the proprietor of a hotel in Nuggetty Gully in the good old days when Nuggetty Hill was in its prime and the local crushing machine was kept going day and night.

Eustace, who was 71 years of age, died from general break-up of the system.

The Rev. Joseph Ross will preach a funeral sermon on Sunday evening, on which occasion the service will start at 6.45. The remains will be interred in the local cemetery this afternoon.
