An old age pensioner named James Webb, residing in Moora road, Rush worth, died very suddenly on the evening of the 7th inst.

It would appear that he proceeded to Mrs Mathers' wine hall with the object of procuring a bottle of wine, and while standing at the counter he suddenly collapsed, heart failure being the cause of death.

A peculiar coincidence in connection with the old man's death was that while at the same place some months ago he had a similar seizure but on that occasion he revived.

Deceased and his brother lived together as mates for the past sixty years, and were very much attached to each other.
