DEATH

TAYLOR. On the 19th inst., at her residence, Moora, Jane Taylor (widow of the late Timothy Taylor), formerly of County of Durham, England.

Deeply regretted by many sorrowing relatives and friends.

Profound grief was the feeling that prevailed in Rushworth on Tuesday when it became known that Mrs Timothy Taylor, senr., of Moora, who passed away suddenly during the previous night. The deceased lady, who had not been in the best of health for some time, retired early on Monday evening, and about one o'clock on the following morning complained to one of her daughters, who was residing with her, and expired in about 25 minutes, the cause of death being disease of the heart.

The deceased, who was a native of Durham, England, joined her husband in Rushworth about 34 years ago, he having sent for her on becoming part owner of one of the rich claims on Nuggetty hill.

The late Mrs Taylor, who was very highly respected, leaves two daughters and five sons, amongst them being Mr T. Taylor, J. P. , who is a member of the Waranga Shire Council and chairman of the Echuca and Waranga Trust.

SUDDEN DEATH. RUSHWORTH, Tuesday.

Mrs Jane Taylor, an old and respected resident, last night went to bed at her farm, Moora, apparently in good health, but about 1 o'clock this morning, she called a daughter from the next room, saying she wanted something put on her chest, as she felt choking.

They put on a mustard plaster, and gave her a drink of water. She asked that a Mrs. Murray be brought from a neighboring farm, but before Mrs. Murray arrived death had occurred. Only 25 minutes elapsed from the time her daughter was called until she was dead.

A magisterial inquiry was held to-day, and a verdict of death from heart disease was returned.

Cr. T. Taylor, chairman of the United Echuca and Waranga Water Trust, is a son of deceased.
