# John Crawley

## 14 June, 1901

Residents of this district will regret to learn that Mr J. Crawley expired at his residence, Cemetery Street, Rushworth, on Wednesday morning from asthma, after an illness of several years, aged 71.

The late Mr Crawley was a very old resident of Rushworth. On his arrival here in 1854 he followed the occupation of a miner, but finding that that did not prove too remunerative he turned his attention to contracting under the shire council, and he followed that occupation

as long as his health would permit.

Some 30 years ago he was elected a member of the Sandhurst Mining Board, and he continued to occupy the position till defeated by Mr J. Potter at the last election.

He was also librarian at the local mechanics' institute for a considerable period.

The deceased, who was well and favorably known, was highly respected. He leaves a grown-up family to mourn their loss.

The remains will be interred in the local cemetery at 4 this afternoon.
