The death occurred on Tuesday of Mr. John Danckert, of Rushworth, licensee of the Criterion Hotel, who passed away at his home after an illness lasting eight months.

The late Mr. Danckert was aged 67 years. He was born at Deniliquin, N.S.W., and married Miss K. Weller, who, with a family of two sons and four daughters, survives him. He carried on business in various suburbs of Melbourne for some years and also engaged in hotel-keeping, having conducted hotels at Rainbow, Tongala, Warragul and Wycheproof before coming to Rushworth a little over two years ago. He was held in the highest esteem by a very wide circle of friends in widely separated parts.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Thursday, the funeral service leaving St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church, where a short service was held. The service at the graveside was conducted by the Rev. Father Tehan.

The pall-bearers were Messrs. J. Barlow, J. Koopman, J. Richards, and A. Budd; the coffin-bearers Messrs. P. Hayes, P. McGuire, K. King, J. Hageman, M. Roach and R. Kennedy and the flower-bearer Mr W. Rolfe.
