## 21 September, 1930

A very sudden death occurred at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. F. Honeychurch, Stanhope Road, on Saturday evening. Mr. John G. Eddy, a brother of Mrs. Honeychurch, who was on a visit to his sister, with whom he had been staying for the past three weeks, went down the yard.

Mr. Honeychurch had been preparing to motor him to his home in Greensborough and went down the yard to tell him he was ready to start, when he found Mr. Eddy dead, death having been due to heart failure.

The late Mr. Eddy, who was 53 years of age, was born in Invergordon and also resided at Freeburgh, near Bright, but for the last 10 years he has resided at Greensborough.

During the last six months Mr. Eddy had been ailing owing to the effects of the injury he received when a baby. His mother and other sisters and brothers who survive him reside at Greensborough.

His sudden death was a great shock to his relatives and much sympathy is expressed in the town of Mr. and Mrs. Honeychurch in their sudden bereavement.

The funeral took place on Sunday, the remains being interred in the Rushworth Cemetery, the Rev J. Tyson officiating at the graveside.
