Yet another of the pioneers has passed to his reward, with the death of Mr. John McLennan, of Stanhope, who died on Friday last, in his 84th year.

He was born at Inverness, Scotland, but came Australia as a baby only a few months old, being a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Roderick McLennan of Warrenbeen, Shelford. For some years he was manager of the Dhurringile and Kiota estates and moved to Stanhope about 18 years ago.

Only last October Mr. McLennan suffered an irreparable loss in the death of his wife, and the sympathy of a very large circle of friends is extended to the family in the great bereavement.

The late John McLennan will be greatly missed. An upright and God-fearing man, he was typical of the stock from which he came, the people who have done a great share in making the Empire to which we belong.

He brought industry and intelligence to his life's work and was a successful farmer and pastoralist. Withal, he had a kindness and generosity that earned for him a high regard from those who knew him, and they will greatly regret his passing.

The bereaved family are Anne, Alex, Mollie, Sadie, Roy and Jim. Two daughters predeceased him.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Saturday, when there was a large and representative attendance at the graveside. The funeral service was conducted by Mr. A. F. Landers.
