

Master Thomas H. Hinchcliffe

On November 9th, Master Thomas Hinchcliffe, only son of Mr and Mrs Hinchcliffe, Church Hill, Rushworth, was a few days before his 17th birthday, called to the Higher Life after a lengthy and painful illness, which he bore most patiently.

At the close of the burial service the Band played "Sun of My Soul" and Bandmaster F. Rich sounded "The Last Post".
