

Miss Hazel Wilson

The death of Miss. Hazel Wilson, aged 28 ½ years, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Wilson, senior, of Moora street, occurred at the Austin Hospital on Tuesday morning.

She spent her early days at Graytown and was educated at Rushworth. She then entered on a training course in the nursing profession at Mooroopna and spent another two years in various parts of Victoria. Early in 1937 she entered the Queen Victoria Hospital for further training. When this course was almost completed she became suddenly ill, and, after a few weeks, was transferred to a sanatorium and was treated at other institutions and finally became an inmate of the Austin Hospital at Heidelberg.

Whilst at Rushworth she was a very popular elocutionist and appeared in several concerts. She was also an enthusiastic member of the Independent Order of Rechabites Lodge and took an active part in both adult and junior branches.

The deceased possessed a bright and cheerful disposition and made many friends who will regret her passing.

The funeral took place at the Rushworth Cemetery on Wednesday afternoon.
