

Mr Albert Groves-White

Much regret was expressed in Rushworth when it was learned that the death had occurred in Epworth Private Hospital of Mr A. Groves-White, second eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. G. Groves-White, who were amongst the oldest pioneers of this district.

For some time past the late Mr. White has not been in good health and about five or six weeks ago he went to the Epworth Private Hospital for special treatment, but he gradually sank and died on Friday last.

The late Mr. White, who was 69 years of age, was born at Wanalta, where his father had grazing interests. He lived for many years in that district, but during the latter part of his life resided in Rushworth.

He was of a generous nature and his purse was always open to help deserving cases. He was a well-known and familiar personality in the life of the town, and he will be greatly missed by his large circle of friends.

He was married late in life, but had no family.

He was a member of the Jubilee Lodge of Freemasons. He was very fond of music and in the earlier years of his life assisted in playing at dances and other functions.

The funeral took place on Saturday last, the remains being brought from Melbourne for interment in the Rushworth Cemetery, the funeral cortege being a lengthy one.

The burial service of the Presbyterian Church was read by Mr. Michell and the Masonic service by Wor. Bro. P. H. Peart.
