A very sudden death occurred at Mr Dougal Cameron's residence. Stanhope road, on Tuesday morning. It seems that an old gentleman named Alexander Ross, aged 75 years, a son of Mr Ross, L.L.D., of Tain, Ross-shire, Scotland, who has been staying off and on with Mr Cameron for some ten years, was dressing to come up the town for the purpose of transacting some business and while he had his arms raised above his head in the act of putting on a shirt, he fell forward on the bed and expired without uttering a sound.

The deceased was a very old colonist, having arrived in Sydney in 1853. Some years after, he came to Victoria. He was principally engaged in banking business and rose to the position of

manager before he retired.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Wednesday. The Rev. J. Weir officiated at the grave. Mr Anderson had charge of the funeral arrangements.
