## Mr Finley McNicol

Mr Finley McNicol, a well-known mining identity in this and the Costerfield district, died at Colbinabbin on Monday last. Deceased, who was a son of Mr John McNicol, of South Costerfield, came to Rushworth many years ago, at the time when the Hard Hill mines were in full swing, and continued in employment there until the mines shut down. He then did a little prospecting on his own and later went to Sedgwick, where he worked for some time. It was here that he became so bad with miner's consumption that he was compelled to relinquish work. At the time of his death he was residing with his daughter, at Colbinabbin at which place he died.

He leaves a family of five children, all pretty well grown up, and at the time of his death was 48 years of age.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Wednesday. The Rev. Jas. Weir conducted the service, Mr Anderson having charge of the funeral arrangements.
