One of the oldest residents of Rushworth passed away in the Mooroopna Hospital on Saturday, October 29th, in the person of Mr. Leo Carosin.

Mr Carosin has been in bad health for some time past, and gradually grew worse. He at length was compelled to go to the Mooroopna Hospital a few days before his death.

The late Mr. Leo Carosin was born in Mauritius (a French colony off the coast of Africa) and came to Rushworth about 36 years ago. He and Mr. W. Dark went into partnership as dealers, etc., in Moora street.

Some time after Mr Dark left Rushworth and Mr Carosin kept on the business on his own. He afterwards removed to High street, where he conducted a fruit and confectionery business till failing health compelled him to dispose of it.

He was very much respected during his lifetime in Rushworth, during which he did many kindly acts.

The funeral took place on Monday last week, the remains being brought from Mooroopna for interment in the Rushworth Cemetery.

The burial service was conducted by Rev. Father Tehan, Mr. E. F. Anderson having charge of the funeral arrangements.
