We regret to have to report the death of Mr Richard Teece, a resident of Wanalta. It seems that he went to Melbourne a few days since to see his sister, who was on her way from the old country to New Zealand, and there caught a cold, which developed into pleurisy and pneumonia. On arriving at Mr Ferris' he found himself too ill to proceed to his home, and he went to bed and Dr Christie was sent for, but the disease had got too firm a hold for anything to be done for him and he expired about noon yesterday.

The deceased, who was a good genuine man, was very popular with his neighbours, and in fact with all who came in contact with him. He took a great interest in the advancement of the district, and attended all the meetings that had that object in view. He was only 31 years of age.

The remains will be interred in the Rushworth cemetery today, at 3 p.m.
