It is with regret that we record the death of Mr John Rose, which took place at his late residence, Moora road, Rushworth, on Friday morning last.

Some years ago deceased suffered a stroke of paralysis, and he was never strong afterwards. He was 68 years of age, and his death came about in a very peaceful manner, he gradually sinking and passing away.

Mr Rose was very widely known and highly respected, as was shown by the number of people who accorded him the last tribute of respect on Sunday by following his remains to their last resting-place in the local cemetery, where Mr Raff read the funeral service.

Deceased was an old member of the local branch of the Grand United Order of Oddfellows and the members, to the strength of thirty, led the funeral procession, Bros. Lapeyre, Geisler, Ahern and Hicks acting as pall-bearers and the service at the graveside being read by Bro. E. A. Muhlhan.
