DEATH OF MRS. WILLIAMSON.

It is with feelings of deep regret that we record the death of Mrs Williamson, wife of Mr A. J. Williamson, of the Bank of Victoria, Rushworth, which sad event occurred on the evening of Thursday, the 11th inst.

Mrs Williamson came to Rushworth with her husband some four years ago, but during the latter portion of this time she has had very indifferent health. She suffered from an internal complaint and during the past five or six weeks was confined to her bed. Mrs Williamson was a member of the local Benevolent and Dorcas Society, in which she took an active interest, and her death is a loss to the society.

She was very widely respected, and much sympathy is felt for Mr Williamson, his two sons and daughter in their affliction.

The funeral on Friday last was largely attended, thus showing the great esteem in which she was held by all.
