It came as a shock to her many friends when the news of the death of Mrs Enders, wife of Mr Frank Enders, became known on Tuesday.

Like Mr Crothers, deceased was also a respected identify of Carag, where she had resided with her husband for many years, but was unlike him in this respect—that she was a woman in the prime of life, being but 44 years of age.

Mrs Enders was to all appearances a hale and hearty woman up to a comparatively short time ago, but it now appears that she was maintaining a spirit of joviality in the presence of outsiders which she was far from feeling in private life. She suffered with an affection of the throat, and although it was recognised that her case was hopeless her death was hardly expected so soon.

Deceased was a pleasant, kindly lady, of a generous disposition, and her demise is deplored by all who knew her.

She was also accorded a fitting tribute by the number of people who showed the last tribute of respect by attending the funeral yesterday, when the Rev. Vian again officiated.

Deceased leaves a large family and a sorrowing husband, and for them the utmost sympathy is felt.

Mr Thomas Crothers and Mrs Julia Geisler were the other two deaths of that week.
