Our readers will learn with extreme regret that the wife of Mr George Mapleback, brewer, of Rushworth, passed away on Monday morning last, after a short illness.

A pathetic feature in connection with Mrs Mapleback's death is the fact she recently gave birth to a child. She was getting along splendidly, but when she got about again did not exercise sufficient care and contracted a chill, which caused a relapse and ultimately brought about her death.

The blow is a severe one for Mr Mapleback, who is left with four young children to care for, the youngest being but three weeks old.

Mrs Mapleback was only a young woman in the prime of life, being 40 years of age, and general regret is expressed at her untimely demise.

The remains were interred in the local cemetery on Tuesday afternoon, the Rev. Father Mulcreevy conducting the burial service and a very large number of mourners being in attendance.
