The death occurred at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. D. McCormack of Euroa, of Mrs. Hannah Ryan, relict of the late Mr. Hugh Ryan, on Sunday evening last.

The late Mrs. Ryan was for many years a resident of Kyabram and was a colonist of 67 years. Born at Tipperary, Ireland, the deceased left for Australia in 1871 and, after a voyage occupying almost 12 months, arrived in the year 1872.

Her husband selected land in the Kyabram district in the early days and after seven years on the land he took over the Commercial Hotel at Kyabram, which business they carried on until 1911.

The late Mrs. Ryan's husband predeceased her 20 years ago when she went to reside in the metropolis, afterwards going to Euroa to live with her only surviving daughter, Mrs. D. McCormack.

The funeral was conducted to the Rushworth cemetery on Tuesday morning last, the last rites at the graveside being conducted by Rev. Father Tehan.

The pall-bearers were Messrs S. Doolan, M. Doolan, J. Ryan, N. Ryan, T. Ryan and the casket was carried by Messrs T. McCormack, M. Ryan, J. Mitchell, W. White, P. Cook and J. Nolan.
