A very sad death occurred at the Mooroopna Hospital on Friday morning last, when Mrs Crawford, wife of Mr J. A. Crawford, of the Waranga Outlet, expired rather suddenly.

Deceased left Rushworth for the hospital in company with her husband by the previous Wednesday evening's train, Dr Christie having recommended her removal thereto owing to her suffering from an attack of typhoid fever.

On Thursday morning Mr Crawford returned and he was rather jubilant from the fact that the hospital authorities were of opinion that she was not seriously ill and that she would soon be all right again.

Early on Friday morning, however, a telegram was received that she was dead. An inquest disclosed the fact that deceased had been suffering from a complication of diseases, as well as typhoid.

Deceased was only a young woman, and much sympathy is felt for Mr Crawford, who has been left to mourn his great loss with four young children, the youngest of whom is but three months old.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Saturday afternoon, the Rev. J. R. Walker conducting the burial service.
