The death occurred at the Mooroopna Hospital on Tuesday, 17th inst., of Mr. J. H. G. Weaver, of Stanhope, at the age of 42 years.

The late Mrs. Weaver had been in ill-health for the past three or four months, and became an in-patient of the Mooroopna Hospital about a fortnight ago. It was found necessary to perform an operation, but complications set in and she died rather suddenly.

Mrs. Weaver resided in Rushworth during the year 1920, but she went to Stanhope with her husband and her family, where she resided up to the time of her death.

She took a great interest in the social events in connection with the Stanhope South School and was ever ready to give her assistance to every local movement. She made many friends who deeply regret her untimely death.

She leaves a husband (who is a returned soldier) and a family of six children --- one son and five daughters. Her mother and sister reside in Tasmania.

The funeral took place on Wednesday, the remains being brought from Mooroopna and interred in the Rushworth Cemetery. The pall-bearers were members of the Stanhope Branch of the R.S. & S.I.L.A., the Rushworth Branch being represented by Mr. W. J. Mayron.

The funeral service was conducted by Rev. Canon F. Grist.
