

Mrs J. Teur

Rushworth Chronicle

It is with regret that we chronicle the death of Mrs J. Teur, which sad event occurred at her husband's residence, Station Street, Rushworth, on Saturday night last.

Deceased was quite a young woman, being only 33 years of age, but she was apparently not of a robust constitution. She took ill some three weeks ago, and amongst other ailments suffered with gangrene in the leg. Various complications ensued in rapid succession and but small hopes of her recovery were held out from near the first of her illness.

Deceased was a daughter of the late Mr W. Anderson, of Mooroopna, who, it will be remembered, was drowned on the Shepparton-Mooroopna road about two years ago.

With her husband she had resided in Rushworth about two years, and for some six years previous had been resident of Murchison. She was a very kindly dispositioned lady, earning the good-will of her neighbours, and general regret is expressed at her early demise.

A sorrowing husband and two young children are left to mourn their sad loss, and for them general sympathy is felt.

A large number of mourners followed the remains to the local cemetery on Monday afternoon, the Rev. J . R. Walker performing the funeral obsequies.
