

Mrs Robert Seignior

Rushworth Chronicle

An old and respected resident of Wanalta passed away on Monday afternoon last in the person of Mrs Seignior, wife of Mr Robert Seignior, farmer, of that place.

Deceased came to this district with her husband some nine years ago and has resided on the Wanalta Creek ever since.

She was of a quiet, retiring disposition and was very much respected. Although not of a robust constitution she nevertheless went about as usual until only a few weeks ago, when she became so bad that she was brought into Rushworth and located at Mr F. Plummer's in order that she might have better medical attention. It proved of no avail, however, and she passed away, as stated above, the cause of death being blood poisoning and general debility.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Wednesday afternoon, a large number of sympathisers joining the funeral procession.

The Rev. J. R. Walker conducted the funeral ceremony, the body being conveyed to the church prior to interment.

A sorrowing husband and grown-up family of four sons are left to mourn their loss.

This will be Marion Seignior, buried in the same grave as Robert Seignior, according to Rushworth cemetery records.
