As briefly reported in our last issue, the death occurred on April 28th of Mrs. Selina Golden, wife of Mr. D. Golden, at her residence, Taylor Street, Rushworth.

The deceased lady had not been a good health for the past three months but nothing serious was anticipated. She took a bad turn a few days ago and gradually got worse and passed away as stated.

The late Mrs. S. Golden was a daughter of the late Mrs. E. Merryfull of Rushworth, and was 64 years of age at the time of her death.

She was born at Redcastle, but came to Rushworth when she was very young, and has resided here ever since.

She was much respected by all who knew her and her death is deeply regretted by all her friends.

The late Mrs. Golden was twice married, her first husband being the late Mr. J. Byrne, by whom she had one son, Leo, who was killed at the war. His death gave her a great shock from which she never wholly recovered.

There were no children by the second marriage.

The funeral took place on Friday, the remains being interred in the Rushworth Cemetery, the Rev. F. Grist officiating at the graveside.
