Our readers will regret to hear of the death of Mrs C. W. Turnbull, of Rushworth, which sad event occurred on Tuesday morning last at the Mooroopna Hospital. Deceased some few weeks ago complained of severe internal pains, and, as it was feared she had contracted some serious complaint, she was at once transferred to the Hospital, where she remained until the time of her demise.

She was a middle-aged woman, being but 51 years of age, and came to Rushworth some 28 years ago, where she had resided with her husband (who predeceased her by about two years) ever since.

She was born in Costerfield, and was a daughter of the late John McNicol. The deceased was a woman very well respected by all who knew her, and her death will be keenly felt by her numerous friends. She leaves a family of two sons and three daughters to mourn their great loss.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Wednesday afternoon last, Mr W. Ingram, of the Rushworth Presbyterian Church, officiating at the graveside. A number of mourners accorded the deceased lady their last token of respect.
