

## **Mrs Dunn**

It is with extreme regret that we have to announce the death of Mrs Dunn, from disease of the heart, after a week's illness.

The deceased during the last five years has resided with Mrs A. Davis, one of her daughters, at Moora North.

The late Mrs Dunn came to the colony with her husband in 1852, and after trying their luck at several diggings finally settled in Rushworth in 1858, in which district she has since resided.

The deceased lady, who was 77 years of age, leaves three sons, three daughters, forty-five grand-children, and twelve great-grand-children to mourn their loss. She was greatly esteemed and respected by all with whom she came in contact, and the remains, which were interred alongside her late husband in the Rushworth cemetery yesterday, were followed to the grave by a large number of friends from all parts of the district.

Messrs Coy and Anderson conducted the funeral obsequies, and the Rev. Mr Head, assisted by Mr Gilsenan, read the services at the grave.

It will be remembered by many of our readers that the husband of the deceased met with his death through an unfortunate accident some four years since.
