

Mrs Eliza Griffiths

Considerable regret was expressed on Monday when it became known that Mrs Griffiths had passed away.

It appears that she went to a dam close by for a bucket of water. She reached the dam, and filled the bucket, when she must have had a sudden seizure of some sort, for on her husband going to ascertain what was keeping her, he found her lying near the dam.

Assistance was soon forthcoming and she was carried to her home, where she expired some three or four hours afterwards.

The deceased, who was 75 years of age, was a very old resident of Rushworth. Her husband, who is 79 years of age and has been rather feeble of late years, feels his loss very greatly.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Tuesday afternoon, a large number of friends paying the last tribute of respect.

The Rev. J. R. Walker officiated at the grave, Mr Anderson having charge of the funeral arrangements. Her epitaph should be "a patient, loving woman gone to rest."
