It is with regret that I have to report the sudden death, from heart failure, of Mrs Iddles, wife of Mr Iddles, farmer, Carag Carag.

The deceased was apparently in her usual health when she retired to rest on Friday evening. About 10 p.m. she complained of feeling ill and a doctor was sent for, but she expired in half an hour.

The late Mrs Iddles, who was only 42 years of age, came with her husband from Kyneton to this district in May, 1874, and had resided on the farm he then selected ever since.

She leaves her husband and four children, the oldest 17 and the youngest 11 years of age, to mourn their loss. Her kindly nature endeared her to all who had the pleasure of enjoying her acquaintance and sincere regret is expressed at her demise.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Sunday afternoon, the Rev. Mr McBride, of Kyabram, officiating at the grave. Mr Anderson was the undertaker.
