Yet another of the oldest and most respected identities of the Rushworth district has crossed that bourne from which no traveller returneth in the person of Mrs Isabella Cracknell, relict of the late Mr George Cracknell, who passed away at her late residence, Moora, on Saturday night last.

Deceased, who had only been ailing for a short time, was 73 years of age.

For very many years she assisted her late husband to conduct the business in Rushworth known as The London Bakery, and at present carried on by Mr Harry Wood, but later retired to the farm at Moora, where she has resided for quite a long period.

The late Mrs Cracknell was widely known, more particularly as a lady of charitable disposition, and very few appeals of a charitable nature passed her unheeded. She was of a kind, sympathetic nature, and consequently earned for herself a very large circle of friends, who will regret to learn of her death. She leaves a grown-up family of sons and daughters to mourn her death.

The remains were interred in the local cemetery on Monday after noon, a large number of sympathisers joining the funeral cortege.

The Rev. Finnie, of Murchison, conducted the funeral service.
