The death of Mrs. Jane Hammond, widow of the late Mr. E. G. Hammond, occurred at her residence, Phillips street, Rushworth, on March 26th.

Deceased was 77 years of age, and her death, from heart failure, though sudden, was not unexpected, as for the past two years she had been in indifferent health.

The late Mrs. Hammond, who was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Bennie, of Lancefield, was an old resident of the district, having come at the time of her marriage in 1885, to Waranga, where she resided until a few years ago, when with her late husband she retired to live in Rushworth.

Of a gentle and reserved disposition she devoted her life to her family and home pursuits, and in a quiet and unassuming way spent her life in the interests of others. She made many loyal friends who regret her passing.

Deceased leaves a family of two sons and five daughters, two sons and one daughter having predeceased her. One son gave his life in the Great War.

The burial took place in the Rushworth cemetery on Tuesday of last week. The Rev. Mr. Tyson, of the Methodist Church, Seymour (and formerly of Rushworth) assisted by the Rev. Mr. Hinson, conducted services at the home and graveside.
