

## Mrs McGrillon

She was also all that could be wished as a wife and mother and consequently Mr McGrillon and his six little ones, whose ages range from seven months to 11 years, will feel their loss all the more.

The late Mrs McGrillon was a sister of Mr Jeremiah Dooley, and he thus suffers a second loss within a short time. [Jeremiah lost his son, Jeremiah jnr., aged, seven months, on 13 April, 1889.]

The greatest sympathy is felt for all the relatives in their sad bereavement.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery yesterday.

Mr J. Gallagher, in the absence of the Rev. T. J. O'Connell, officiated at the grave. Mr Munday was the undertaker.
