She did not get up to breakfast, but partook of it before she got up. Her daughter Grace had left her for a few moments, and on returning found that she had passed away.

The late Mrs. LeRoy was a daughter of the late Mr and Mrs Shell, of Meredith. She has resided in the district for over 30 years, Mr. and Mrs. LeRoy having first resided at Whroo for 10 years, and at Rushworth for 20 years.

She was very much esteemed and general regret and sympathy for those bereaved was expressed in the town.

She leaves her sorrowing husband and a family of four sons and four daughters --- William (Rushworth), George (Rushworth), Charles (Shepparton), Ray (Rushworth), May (Mrs. Lowne, West Brunswick) and Grace and Dorrie (Rushworth).

The funeral took place on Friday last, the remains being interred in the Rushworth cemetery. The funeral cortege was a very lengthy one. The grave service was conducted by the Rev. F. E. Haynes, who, in a brief address, referred to the good qualities of the deceased and the great loss to her husband and family by her death.
