One of our oldest settlers, Mr Neil McLarty died at his residence here on Thursday last at the advanced age of 73 years.

Deceased, with his wife and infant daughter, came to the colony in the "Mahomet Pasha" in 1849. The ship met with very heavy weather, and during a storm two of the masts were blown overboard, carrying with them 24 of the crew who were aloft at the time.

Aided by the wreckage that clung to the ship, 16 managed to regain the vessel, the remaining 8 being drowned.

For a good few years deceased was engaged in farming near the Saltwater [Maribyrnong] river and was also at the gold diggings in the early days, and after various ups and downs finally settled here some 26 years ago.

Deceased was of a somewhat reserved disposition, but was universally respected for his sterling honesty.
