Sudden Death.

General regret was expressed on Saturday morning last when it became known that Mr Patrick Cain, a resident of the Waranga Basin, had died very suddenly that morning.

The shock experienced on learning of his death was all the more pronounced from the fact that he had attended the sports meeting at Rushworth on the Tuesday, and, in fact, had been engaged at his usual work at the bank until four o'clock on the previous afternoon.

A magisterial inquiry was held by H. G. Brice, Esq., J. P., on Saturday afternoon, when a finding was arrived at in accordance with the medical testimony, which showed that deceased had died from the effects of acute inflammation of the lungs.

Deceased was employed on the works by Mr Flight for the past three years doing ploughing work. He was regarded as a hardworking and trustworthy employee and since the completion of the work has been engaged ploughing in the numerous drains and depressions at the back of the bank.

He was a married man, and leaves a wife and four children to mourn their sad loss.

The remains were interred in the Rushworth cemetery on Sunday afternoon, a large number of friends following the remains to the grave.
